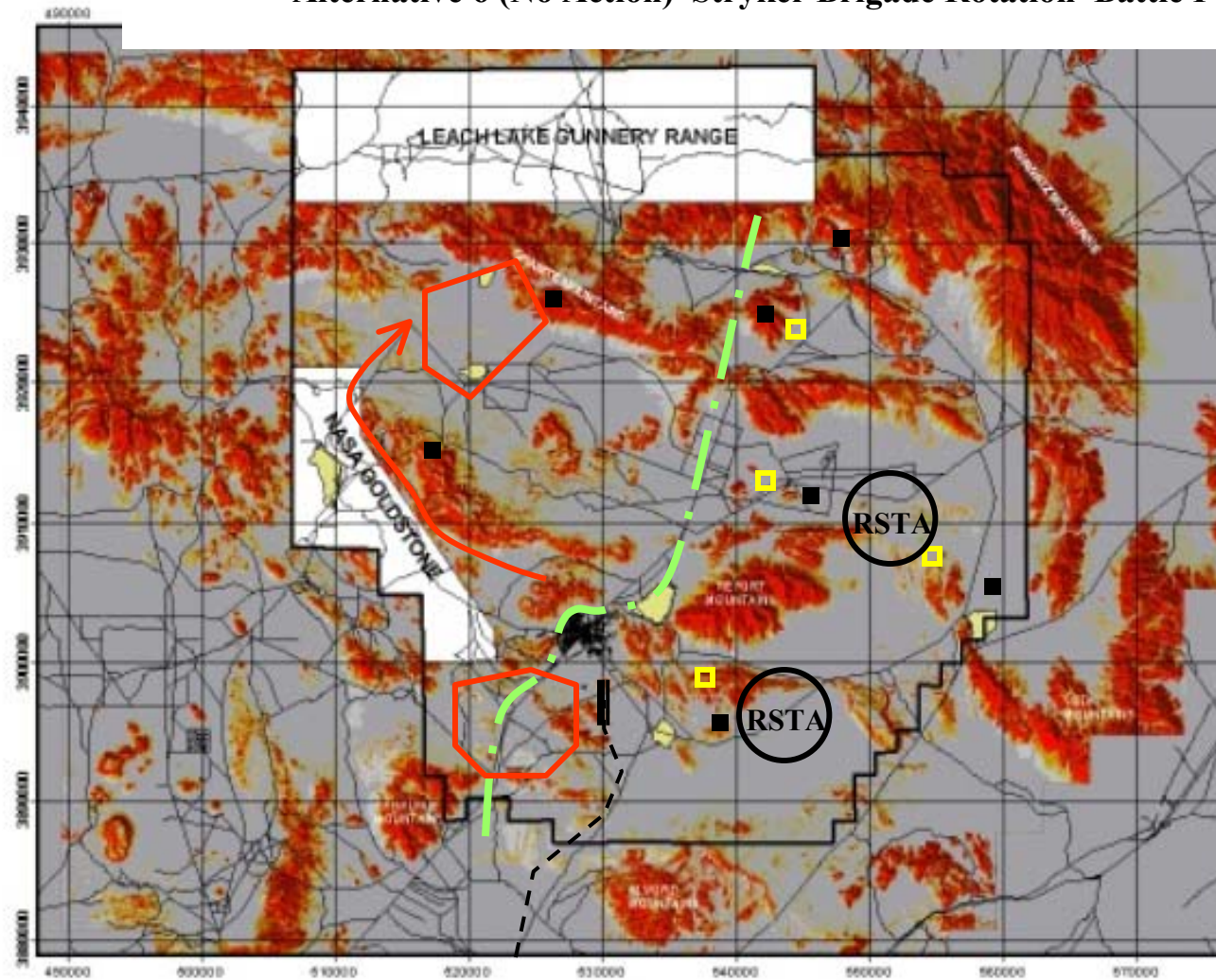


Alternative 6 (No Action) Stryker Brigade Rotation Battle Period: RSOI Day 1

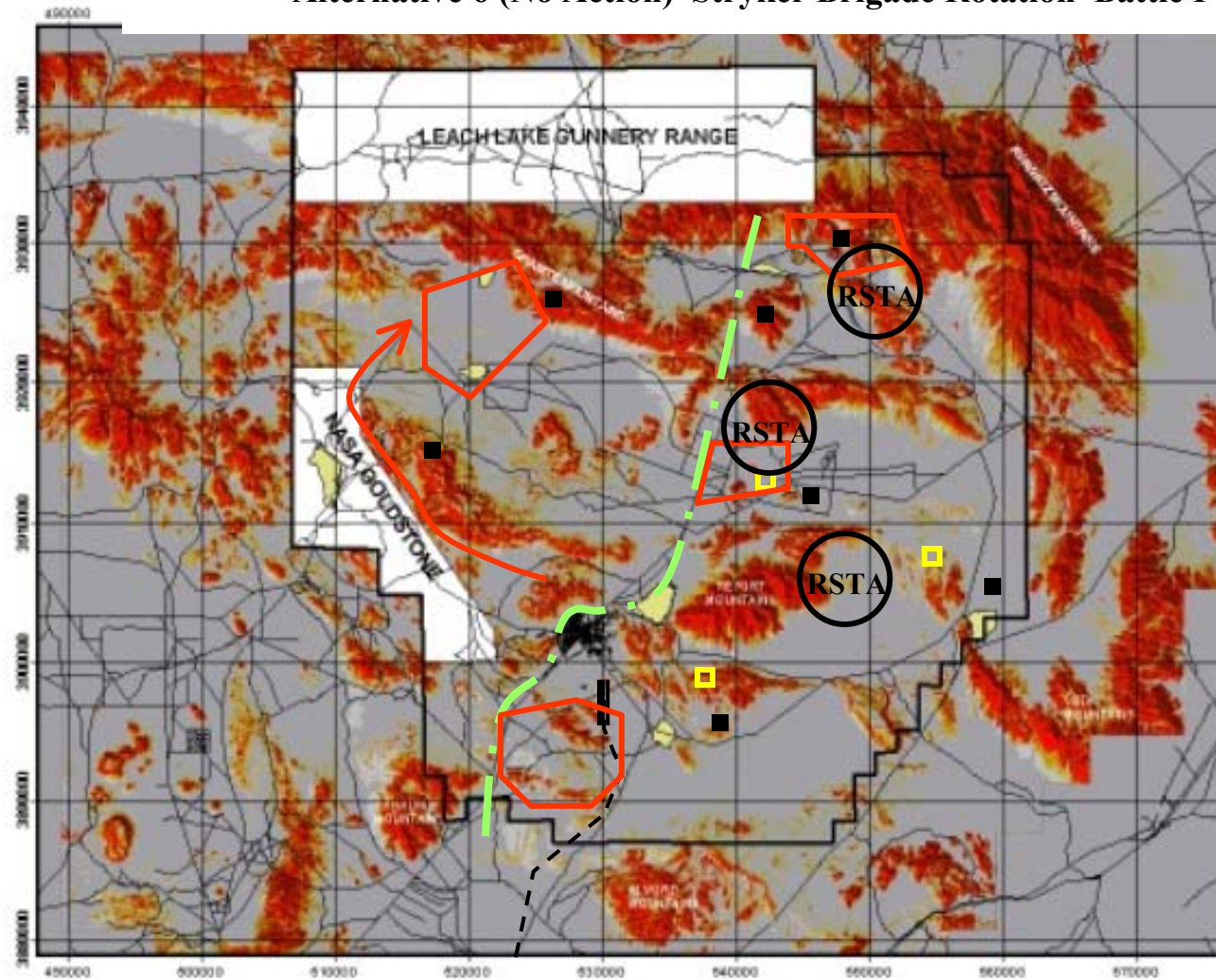
RSTA: The initial forces from the RSTA squadron arrive and begin movement toward East Gate. They identify several key pieces of terrain, a TIM facility and airfield which the SBCT will have to secure to conduct its mission successfully.

OPFOR: The OPFOR is moving from the cantonment area to staging areas in the west. During this time small groups of dismounted soldiers armed with ATGMs are populating the UO sites in anticipation of the SBCTs arrival.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): These personnel will be in the NTC training area throughout the entire training exercise. Some may be hostile toward the SBCT or not. Either way rules of engagement (ROE) will have to be followed.

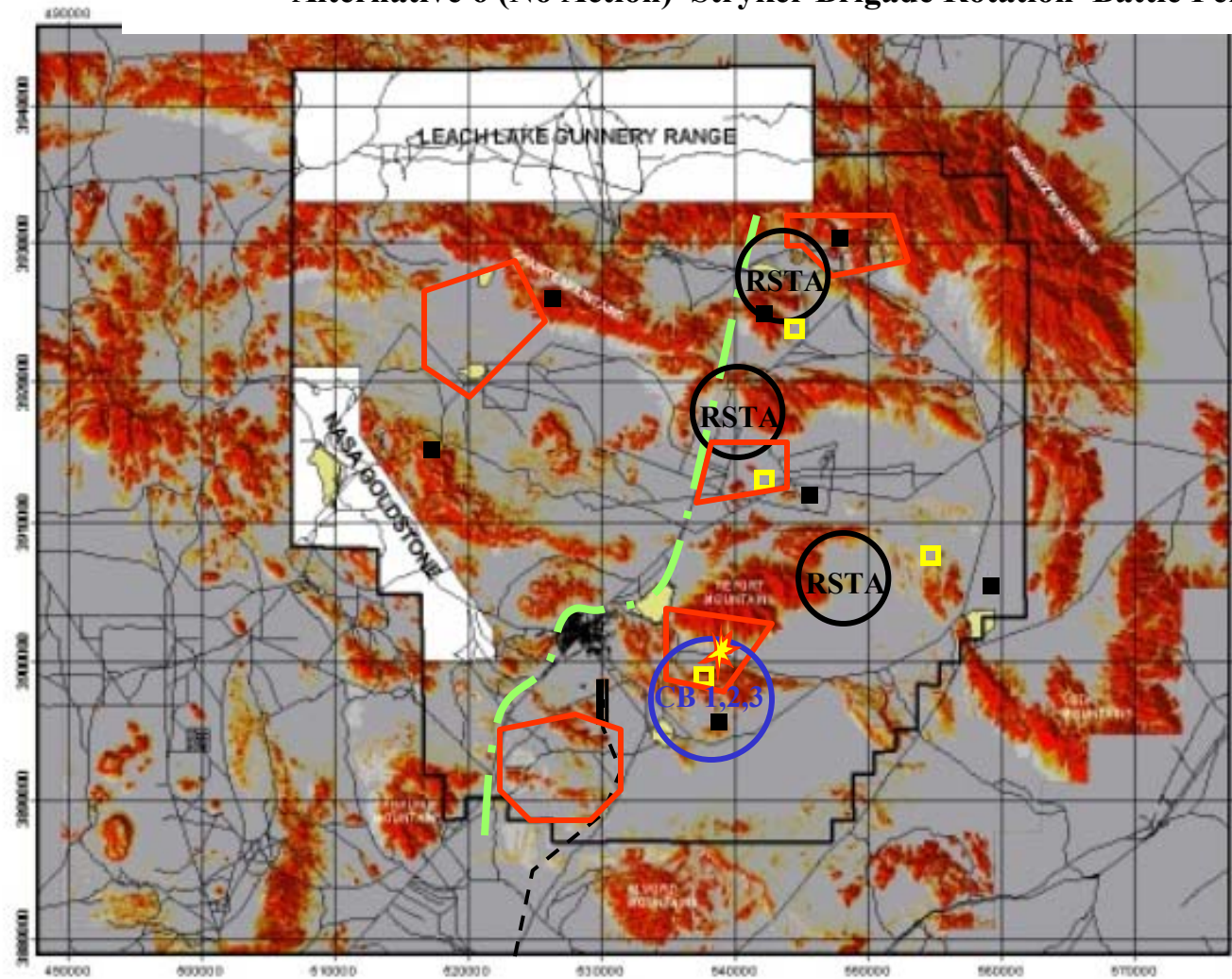
Combat Battalions 1-3: The battalions of the SBCT begin to arrive, and download all necessary equipment prior to moving to their respective assembly areas. The SBCT will have to negotiate through at least one UO site which is populated by COBs and possibly OPFOR militia.

RSTA: Forces from the RSTA squadron continue to arrive, deploy and to provide the SBCT with intelligence. They have identified OPFOR militia within several of the UO sites. Part of the RSTA squadron maintains a presence in the Southern Corridor.

OPFOR: The OPFOR is moving from the cantonment area to staging areas in the west. During this time small groups of dismounted soldiers armed with ATGMs are populating the UO sites in anticipation of the SBCTs arrival. Heavy tracks and wheels are moving to the west and establishing lager sites to support operations across the IZB.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): COBs have occupied the UO sites and are moving throughout the training area.

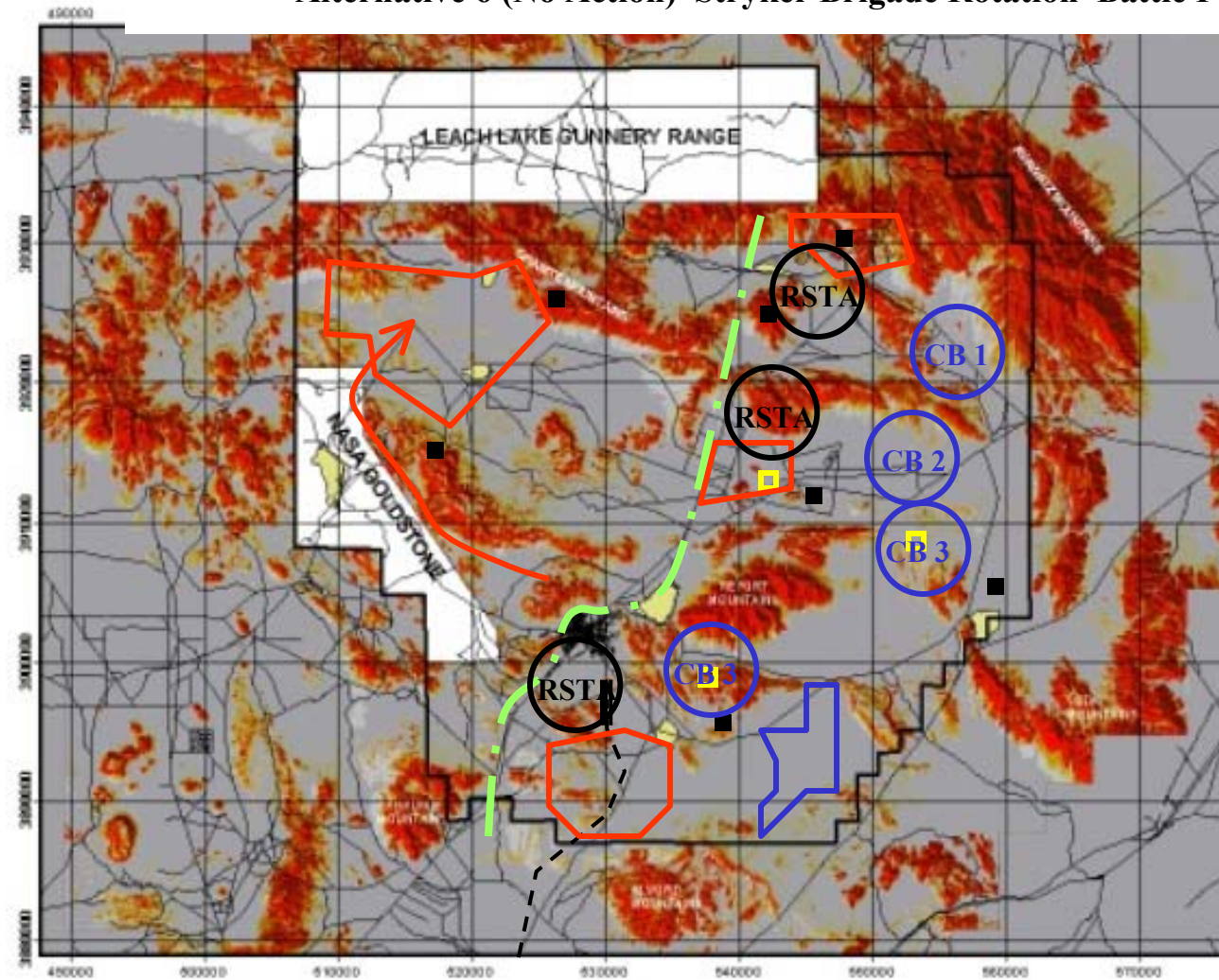
Combat Battalion 1-3: The SBCT has consolidated near the rail spur and has begun to move toward its assembly areas in the east. They encounter resistance from OPFOR militia in the UO site and COBs who are not sympathetic to their mission.

RSTA: Have moved to the IZB and are working to determine the disposition of the COBs in the UO sites while providing intelligence about OPFOR activities along the IZB .

OPFOR: The OPFOR is moving from the cantonment area to staging areas in the west. During this time small groups of dismounted soldiers armed with ATGMs are populating the UO sites in anticipation of the SBCT arrival.

Civilians on the Battlefield: The COBs conduct demonstrations, gather intelligence, disrupt BLUEFOR operations by blocking roads and throwing rocks, steal/destroy US equipment, etc...

Alternative 6 (No Action) Stryker Brigade Rotation Battle Period: RSOI Day 4

Combat Battalion 1: Has established its assembly area and is preparing to secure the northern corridor.

Combat Battalion 2: Has established its assembly area and is preparing to secure the central corridor.

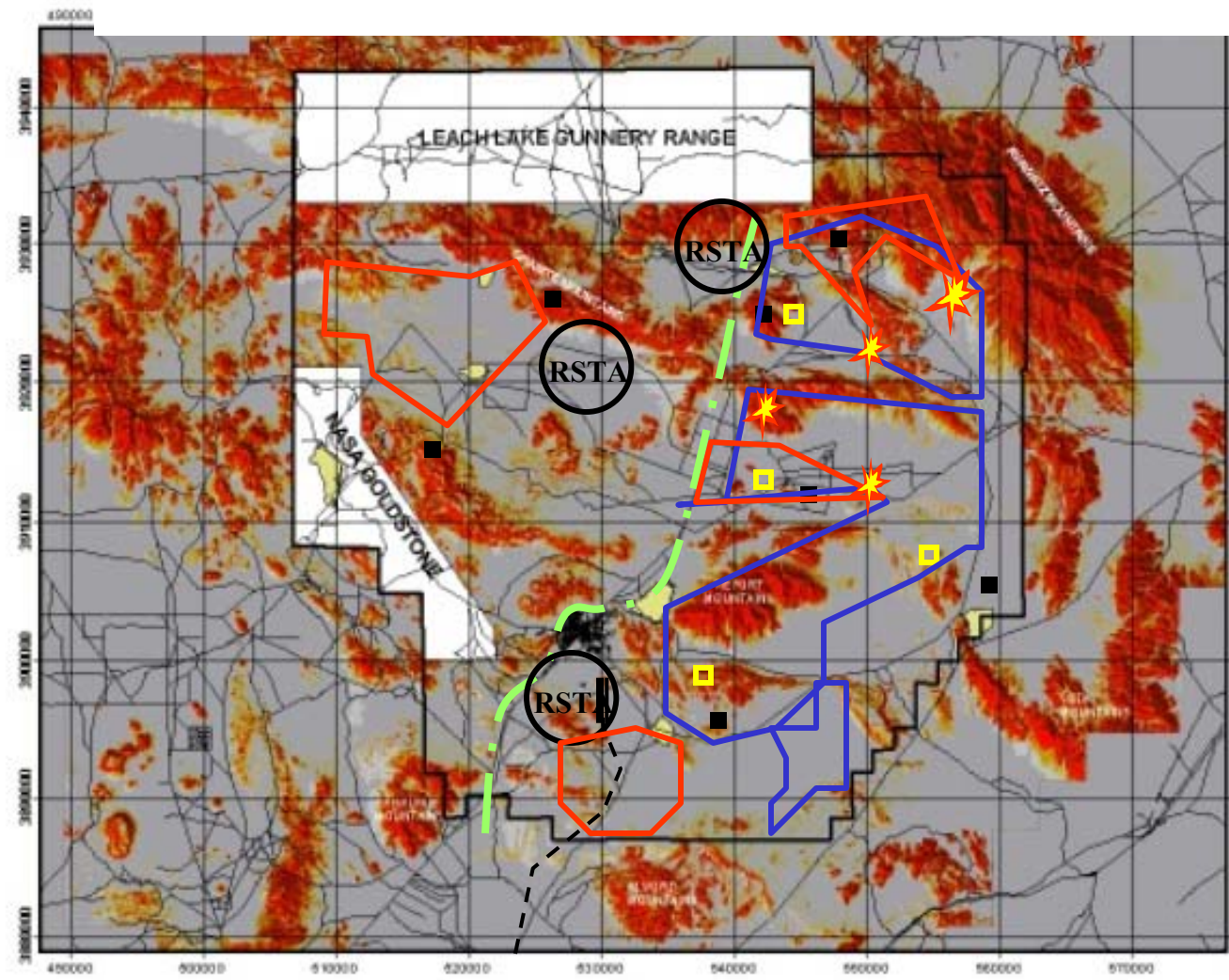
Combat Battalion 3: Has established its assembly area and is preparing to secure the Southern corridor. Elements from CB3 remain in the UO/TIM site to prevent the militia from reoccupying and causing dissent among the COBs.

RSTA: An element of the RSTA squadron moves to the west to provide a screen while the remainder of the squadron moves within the northern and central corridor. The entire squadron remains to the east of the IZB to prevent an escalation of hostilities.

OPFOR: The OPFOR continues to move from the cantonment area to staging areas in the west, and near Langford Lake. The militia has occupied key terrain in and around the UO sites and are working with the COBs to harass the SBCT as it deploys.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): The COBs are still in the UO sites and continue to drive throughout the entire training area.

Alternative 6 (No Action) Stryker Brigade Rotation Battle Period: 1 – Day 1

Combat Battalion 1: Moves west in the Northern Corridor to secure the area for future operations. They encounter resistance from OPFOR militia armed with ATGMs and supported by indirect fire assets.

Combat Battalion 2: Moves west to secure the Capitol City. COBs and militia challenge the battalion as they try to move west. Militia units located on the mountains harass and delay CB2 as they move.

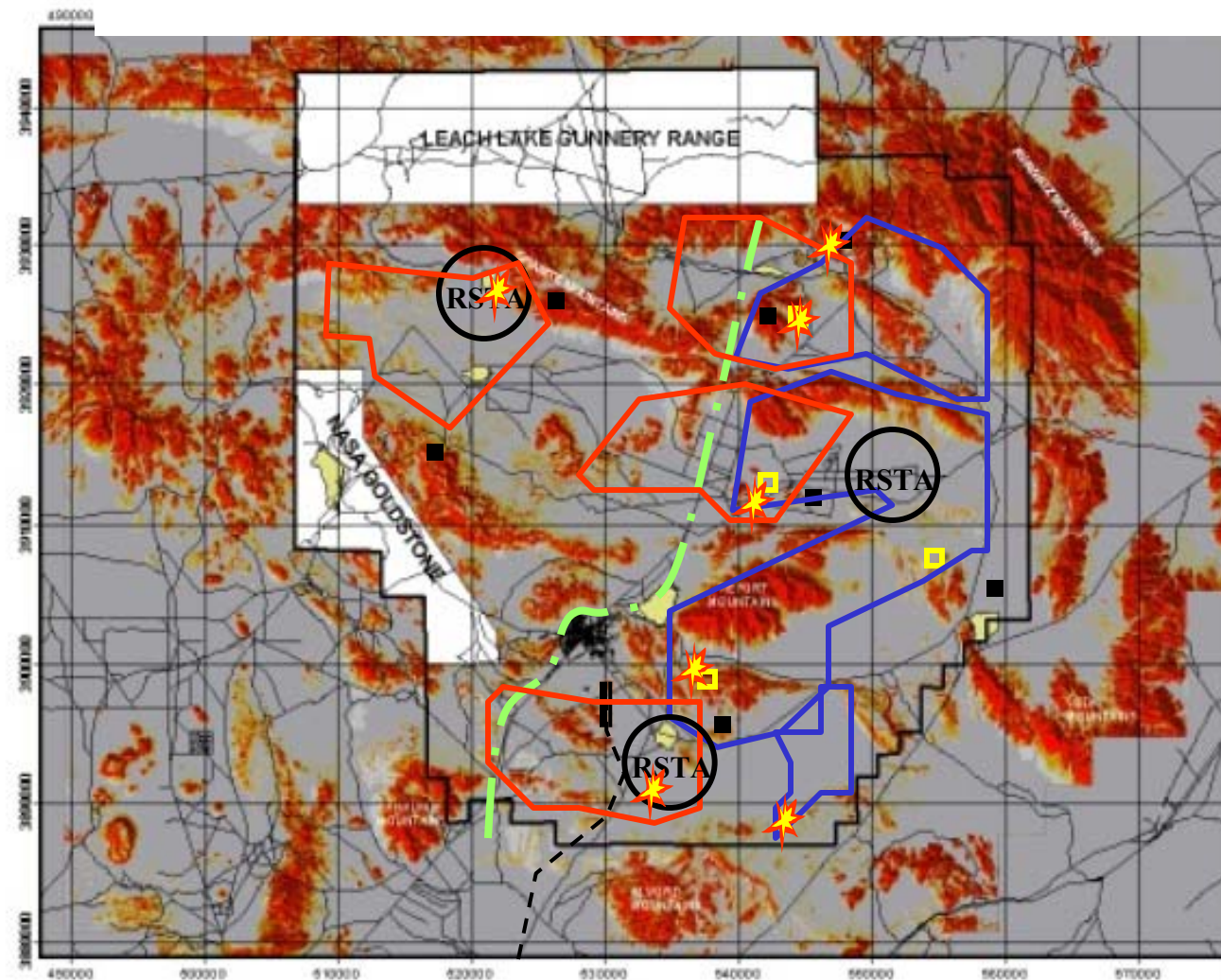
Combat Battalion 3: Continues to maintain a presence at the airfield and TIM site. They begin to reposition forces further east to meet a potential threat identified by the RSTA coming from Superior Valley

RSTA: The RSTA squadron has moved across the IZB in order to verify or deny the possible buildup of OPFOR units to the west.

OPFOR: OPFOR units have massed west of Nelson Lake. They have deployed into platoon sized elements and take advantage of the terrain for cover and concealment. A company with T-80s and BMPs has been identified moving east from Nelson Lake.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): Increased movement within the battle space due to increased SBCT activity. COBs still relatively neutral.

Alternative 6 (No Action) Stryker Brigade Rotation Battle Period: 1 – Day 2

Combat Battalion 1: Meets strong resistance as it approaches the city. The battalion now faces T-80s and BMPs as well as the militia and COBs.

Combat Battalion 2: Faces similar challenges as CB1. Militia and COBs in the Capitol City are significantly hindering the accomplishment of their mission. The OPFOR has committed a larger number of tanks and fighting vehicles to this effort, in order to maintain control of the capitol.

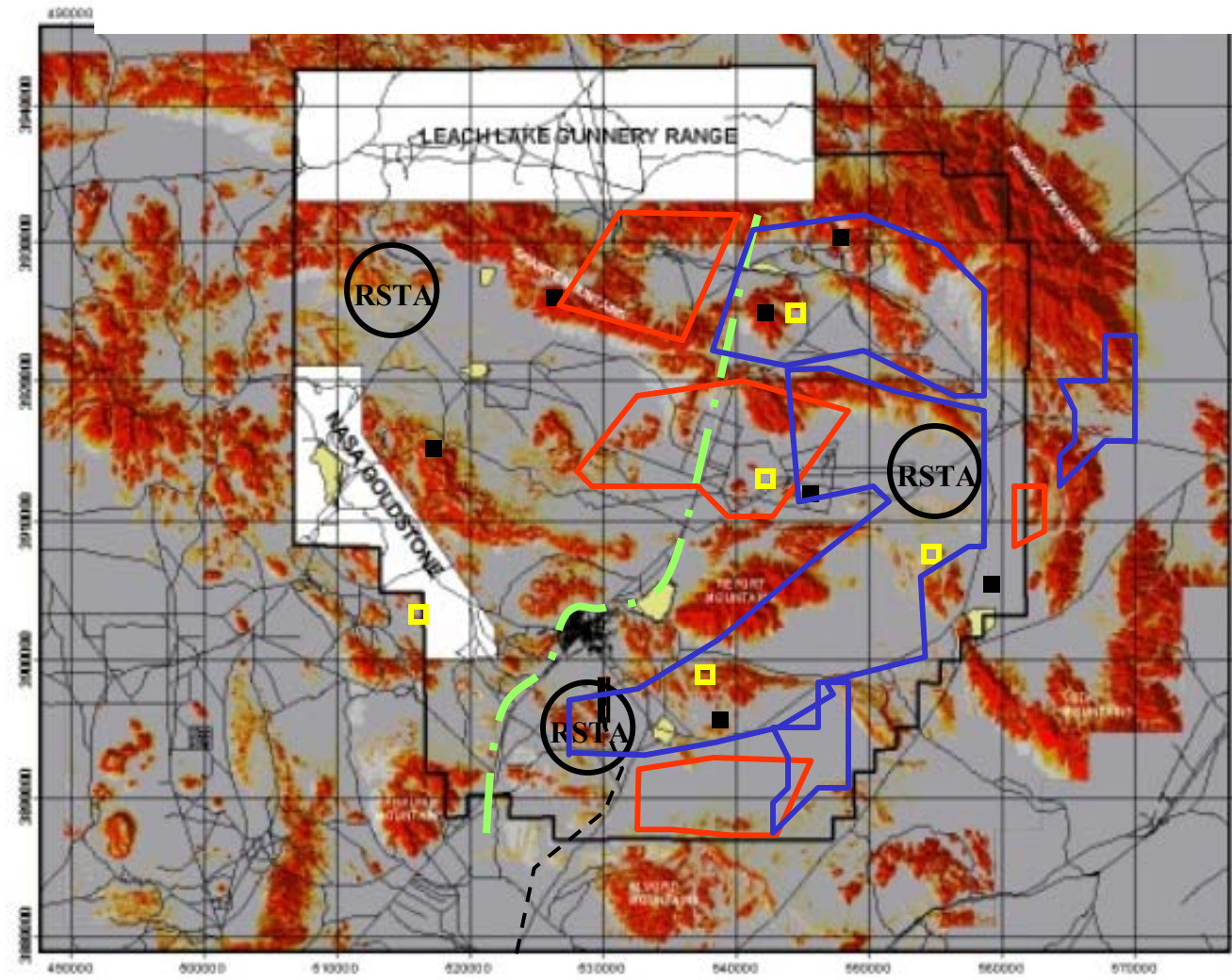
Combat Battalion 3: Is dealing with a TIM spill in the south, and is attempting to secure the access to the rail spur.

RSTA: The RSTA Squadron has successfully engaged the main body of the OPFOR. However, small elements were able to continue east and provide support to militia in the cities. The RSTA was able to destroy a majority of the OPFOR artillery, however enough still exists to effect the SBCT as they move west.

OPFOR: The OPFOR militia still occupies large areas of the AO and continues to harass the SBCT. Heavy forces from the OPFOR have moved east in an attempt to maintain control of the cities. Small numbers of militia have infiltrated behind the SBCT and begin to harass the BSB.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): As tension rises the flow of refugees increases. Activities around the TIM facility have caused toxic chemicals to be released affecting civilians causing them to sympathize with the OPFOR

Combat Battalion 1: Has secured the UO sites in the Northern Corridor, and reestablished the IZB. They are consolidating, and preparing defensive positions and working with the COBs to identify militia.

Combat Battalion 2: Has been unsuccessful in securing the Capitol City. OPFOR and militia still maintains a presence, and threaten to push the SBCT out of the city completely.

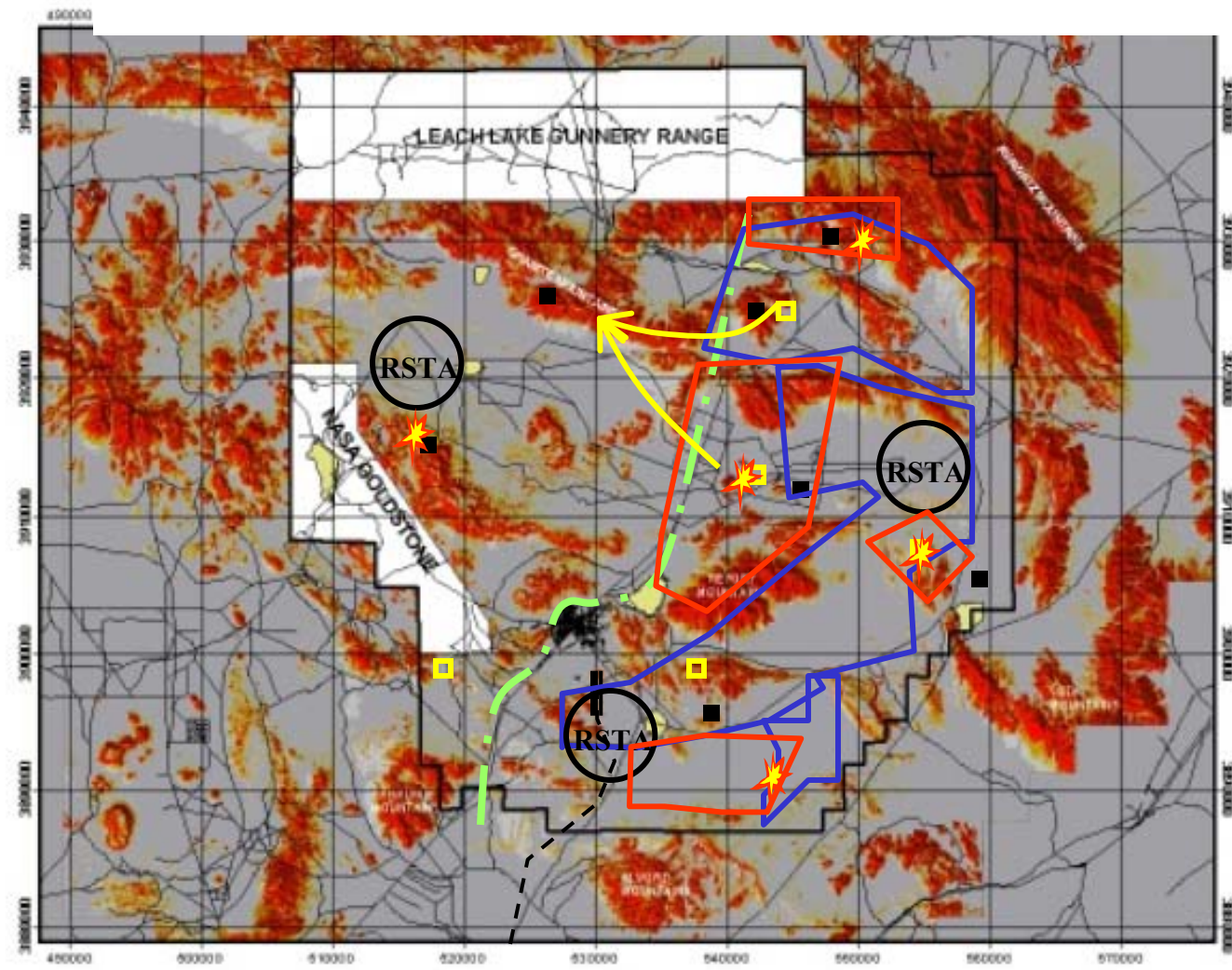
Combat Battalion 3: The TIM spill in the south has been contained, and CB3 is facing a threat from the east after militia groups combined forces in order to conduct a raid on the airfield.

RSTA: The RSTA squadron was successful in destroying follow on forces of the OPFOR. However, one troop was moved to the east to provide a screen against possible attacks against the airfield and BSB. The troop in Superior Valley maintains its presence to prevent the OPFOR from gaining control of the terrain.

OPFOR: Forces in the north have returned west of the IZB, and may reposition to exploit OPFOR success in the central and southern corridors.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): COBs are providing support to the Militia, since SBCT is seen as the cause of the TIM incident, and as the aggressor against the Capitol City.

Combat Battalion 1: Is forced to defend against militia raids. The militia has minimal armor support, but has been very successful in infiltrating through the Avawatz Mountains.

Combat Battalion 2: Is facing an attack by OPFOR armored and heavy tracked vehicles.

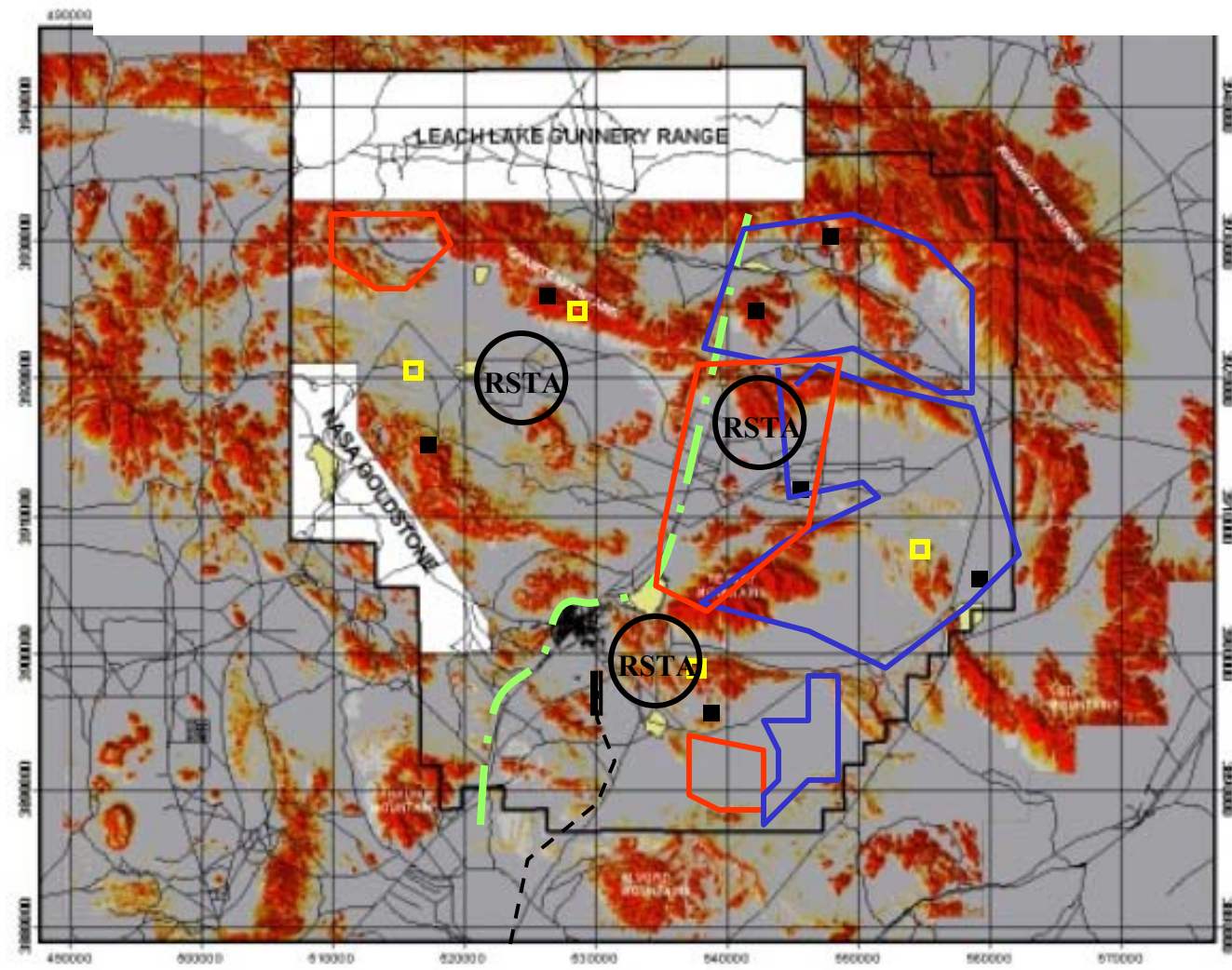
Combat Battalion 3: Is defending El Grazio airfield against militia raids by militia supported by mortars.

RSTA: The RSTA troop in the west has neutralized an OPFOR C2 facility located near Pioneer Lake. One troop remains in Superior valley and orients to the east to provide information about the disposition of OPFOR units moving East .

OPFOR: Forces in the north have repositioned their armored vehicles to exploit OPFOR success in the central and southern corridors. Dismounts infiltrate to the north and attack the northernmost UO site (Limaville) in an attempt to disrupt CB1 activity. Militia continues to harass the BSB, to disrupt resupply of the SBCT.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): Refugees are fleeing cities and are moving west to ward the Granite Mountains. Their movement is hindering the CB's ability to counter attack against the OPFOR in the Northern and Central Corridors.

Combat Battalion 1: The Northern Corridor is secure and the battalion is in the process of clearing the area of OPFOR units.

Combat Battalion 2: Is preparing to attack to regain control of the Capitol City.

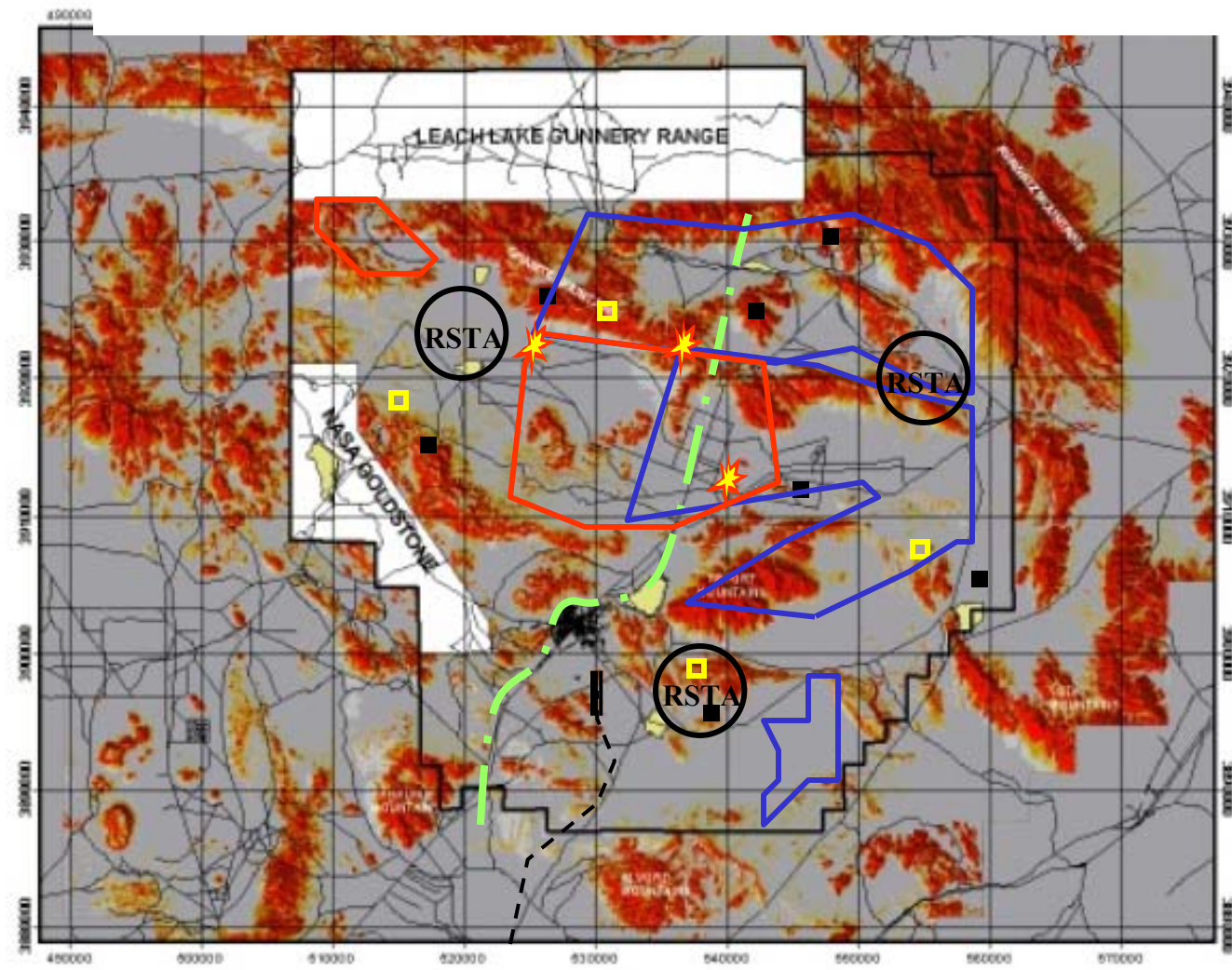
Combat Battalion 3: Maintains a presence at the airfield to prevent further attacks. They are repositioning to reinforce CB2 as they prepare to attack West.

RSTA: The RSTA unit in the west have moved to clarify the disposition of the refugees who have moved west. The RSTA in the South has moved and is screening the southern boundary. RSTA in the Central Corridor are providing information to CB2 as they prepare for the attack.

OPFOR: Are consolidating forces in the Central Corridor to defend against the SBCT attack. They will rely heavily on dismounts armed with ATGMs to spoil the attack. Armored vehicles are positioned to support the fight within the city, but are prepared to move west to prevent their destruction.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): Refugees have been consolidated in the Granite Mountains City. COBs still maintain a presence in the southern corridor, but do not pose a threat at this time.

Alternative 6 (No Action) Stryker Brigade Rotation Battle Period: 2 – Day 3



Combat Battalion 1: Moves to secure Granite City, and to secure the northern flank of the SBCT.

Combat Battalion 2: Attacks west to seize the Capitol City, and reestablish the IZB.

Combat Battalion 3: Defends El Grazio against militia raids by militia and supports CB2s attack into the Capitol City.

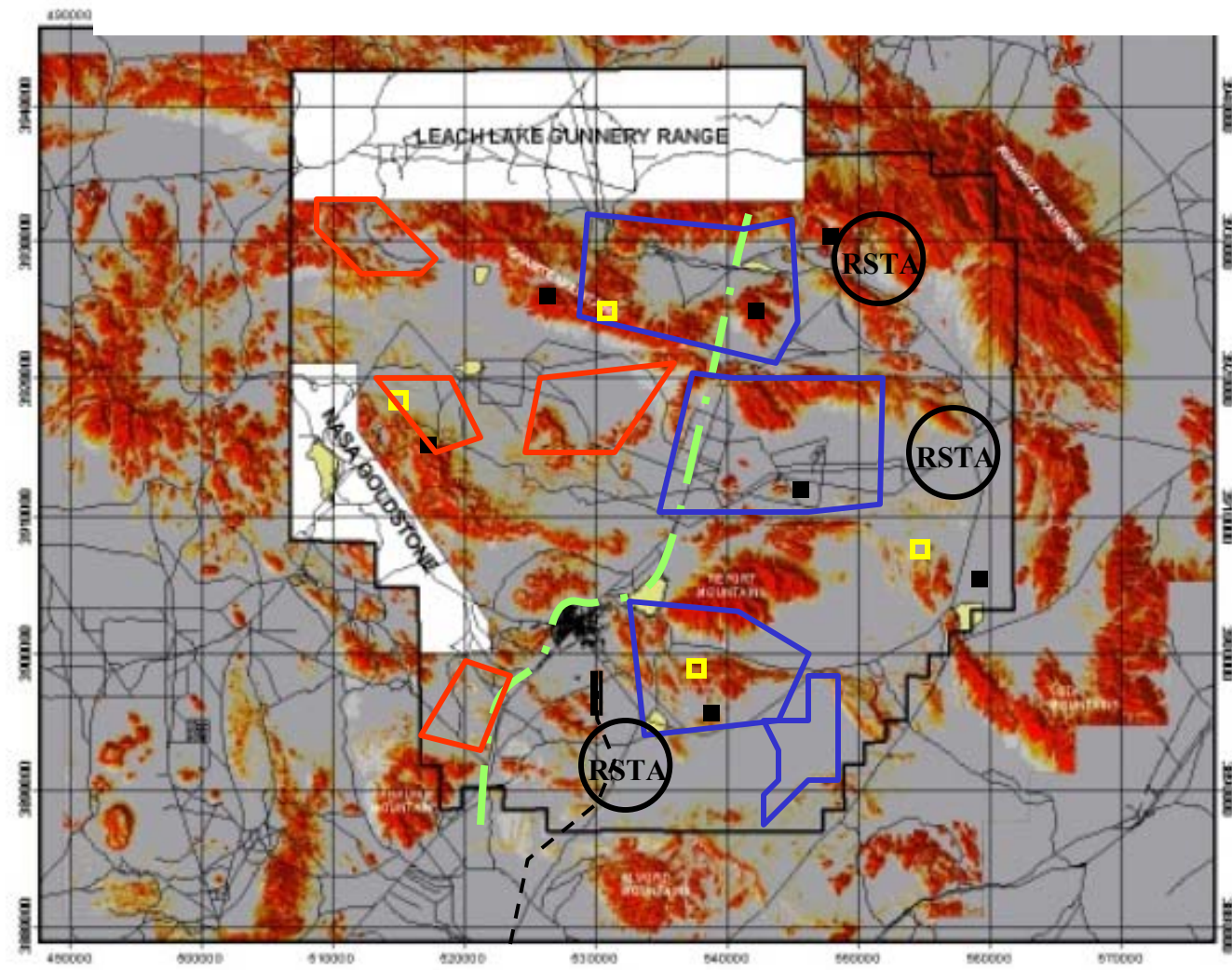
RSTA: The RSTA in the west is assisting in the destruction of OPFOR units as they move west, and provides early warning for possible reserve coming from the west. Refugee movements between Granite City and Pioneer Lake hinder the RSTA's ability to identify OPFOR and Militia movements.

OPFOR: Conducts a defense, relying on the dismounts in the Capitol City to delay the SBCT attack. OPFOR has exploited the movement of COBs to reposition forces to the extreme west.

Civilians on the Battlefield COBs): Refugees are continuing to move throughout the battlespace hindering the SBCT intelligence efforts.

Combat Battalion 3: Prepares to attack West in order to secure the rail spur and clear the Terrorist Training Facility in Superior Valley.

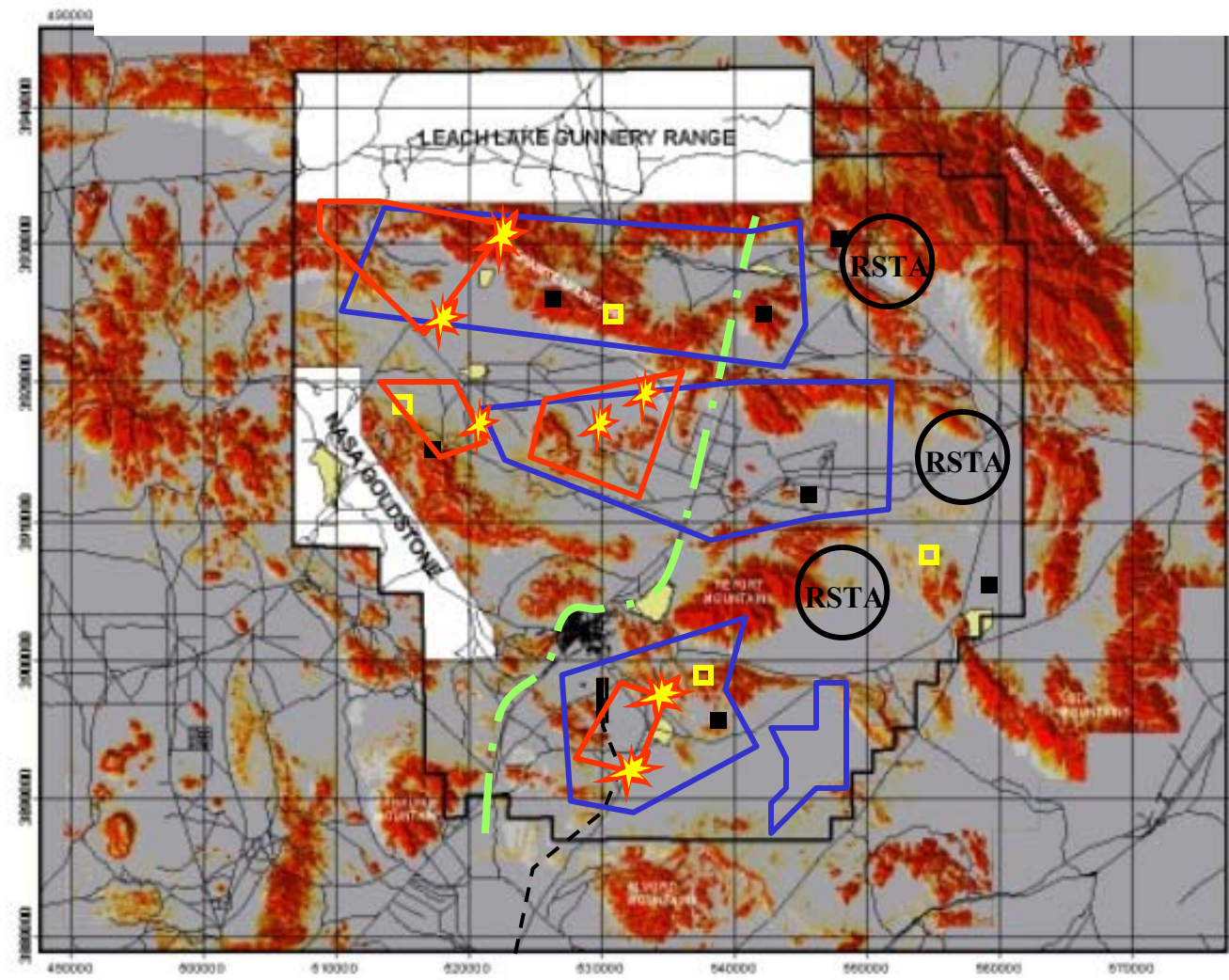
RSTA: The RSTA squadron has moved east and is providing rear area security and monitoring activities in the UO sites.

Combat Battalion 3: Prepares to attack West in order to secure the rail spur and clear the Terrorist Training Facility in Superior Valley.

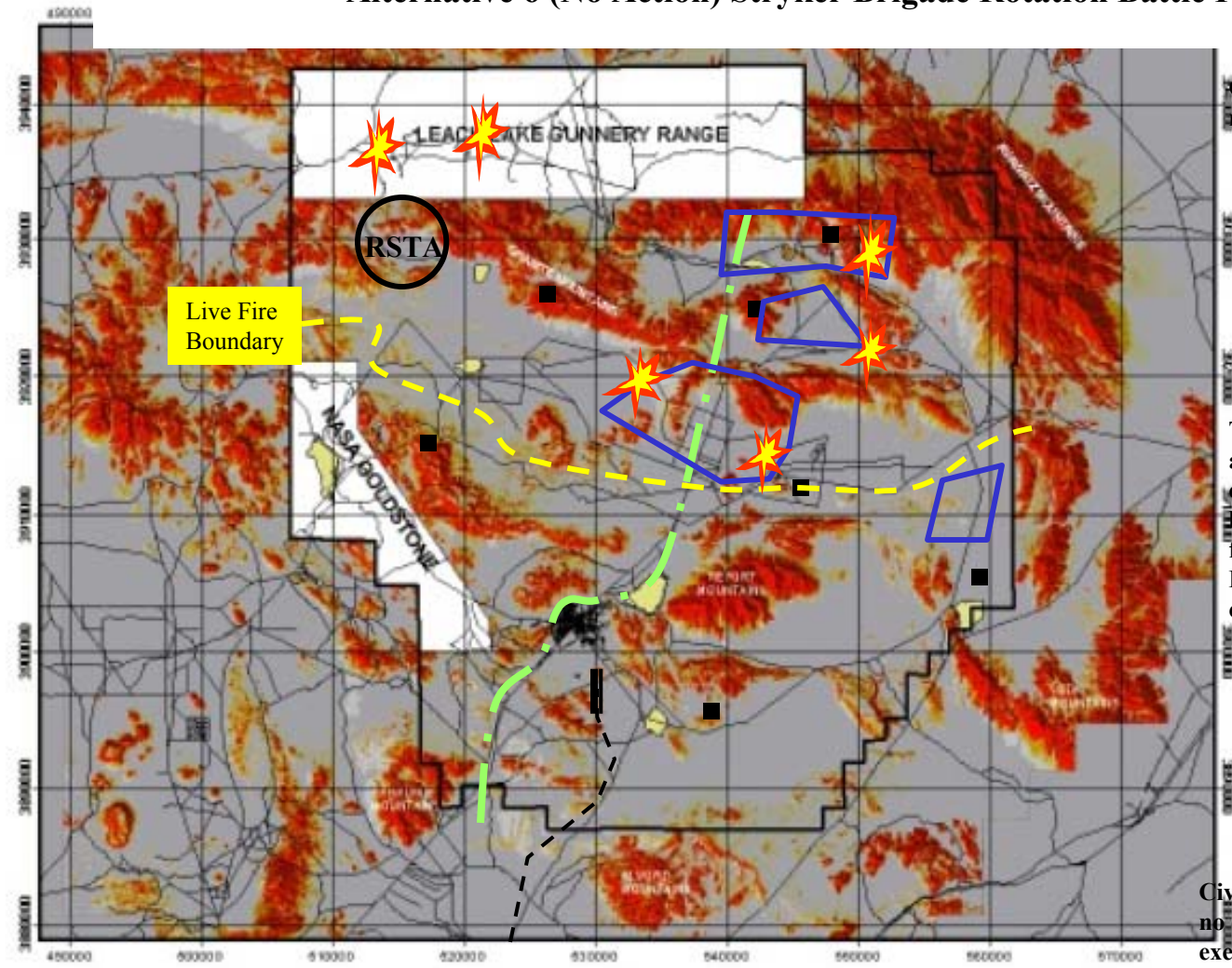
RSTA: The RSTA squadron continues to provide rear area security and monitors activities in the UO sites.

Combat Battalions 1-3 Conduct vignette missions:

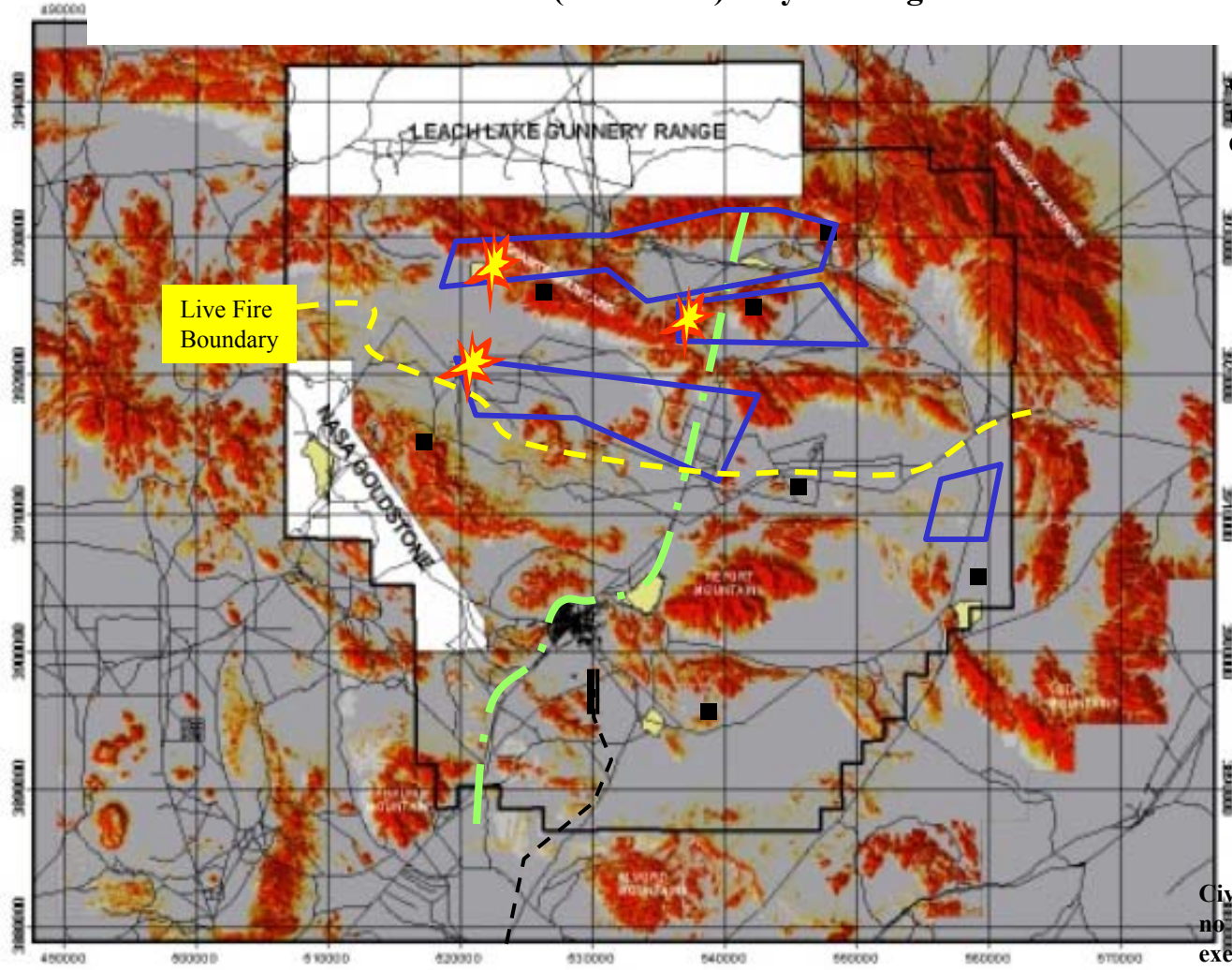
- Deep Attack

The RSTA Squadron identifies deep targets as the SBCT transitions to Live Fire operations. This allows the SBCT to shape the battlefield by employing their aviation and indirect fire assets. The SBCT conducts company level Live fire exercises in Lima Ville and the trench complex to facilitate future operations in the west.
